

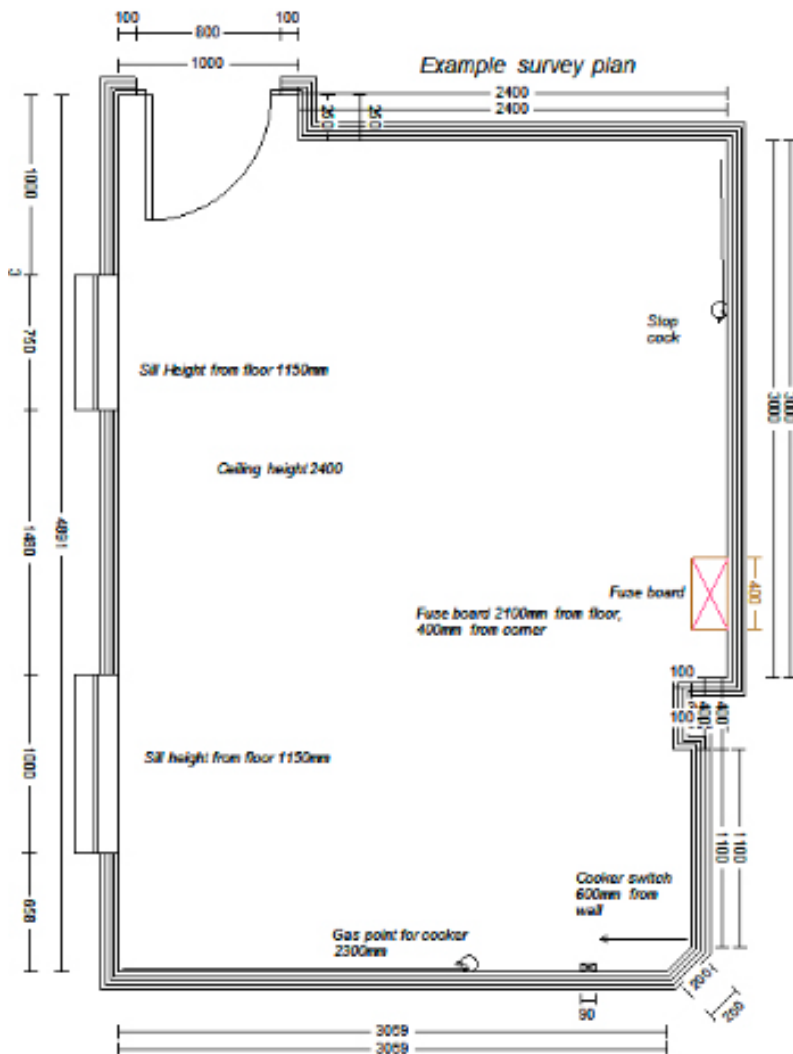
## Design & Planning

To enable us to plan your kitchen, you will need to measure the dimensions of your existing kitchen first. Don't worry about drawing to scale, the graph survey sheet is designed to be easy, as each square is equal to 100mm

It is important to be as accurate as possible and provide as much information as possible.

Measure the whole room, even the door and window frames.

Make a note of any unusual height restrictions like low or sloping ceilings, also measure the height between the window sill and the floor.



Draw the following on to your and include the measurements where they apply:

1. Mains water stop tap
2. Electric cooker switch/Gas supply point
3. Radiators/heaters/base or wall boiler (including height, width, depth and position)
4. Serving hatch (please include height and height from floor to start)
5. Light switches, socket and cooker switches
6. List any appliances you wish to keep in your new kitchen making a note of their height, width and depth
